# Butterfly Conservation Upper Thames Branch Moth Sightings Archive - January to June 2013

~ Sunday 30th June 2013 ~

**Dave Wilton** found a freshly-emerged female **Hornet Moth** at the base of a poplar north of Ludgershall, Bucks on 27th June. His Westcott, Bucks garden trap played host to two additions to his all-time list on 29th June when **Glyphipterix thrasonella** and **Small Ranunculus** put in their first ever appearances. Other first sightings for the year that night included **Emmetia marginea, Cochylis hybridella, Common Emerald, Barred Straw, Dot Moth & Blackneck.**

Andy King reports: "I've had a small 'flock' of moths dancing in the air next to my apple tree all this week in Chorleywood, Bucks. Because of their small size and astonishingly long antennae they might well get taken for gnats, or similar. However, they are **Nemophora degeerella** and well worth a close look for their bright, metallic colours. On 1st April I collected some samples of fungi and rotten wood from Rushmere Park, just inside Bucks. This week an adult **Triaxomera parasitella** emerged from the collection, satisfying for me because it's the first time I've seen this moth."

**Peter Hall and Dave Wilton** ran four MV traps in Bernwood Forest, Bucks on 28th June. New species for the year included Bucculatrix ulmella, Pandemis heparana, Archips crataegana, Ptycholomoides aeriferanus, Cnephasia longana, Epinotia demarniana, Donacaula forficella, Cryptoblabes bistriga, Elegia similella, Common Lutestring, Small Rivulet, Scallop Shell, Orange Moth, Pine Hawk-moth, Rosy Footman, Double Square-spot & Pinion-streaked Snout.

*This report was received from Dave Maunder:* "A few more moths seen in Aylesbury, Bucks recently include: **Hummingbird Hawk-moth** (18th June) on my garden Valerians, also at least four Silver Y at dusk on the Valerians (26th June); Pale Prominent, Willow Beauty, Mother Shipton, Burnet Companion, Cinnabar (four), Aphelia paleana/Timothy Tortrix (seven) & Mullein Iarva (all 19th June); Drinker Iarva (23rd June) & Green Pug (27th June). In my garden trap I've had Pale Oak Beauty & Figure of Eighty (26th June) and Swallow Prominent, Brown Rustic, Angle Shades, Buff Ermine & Peppered Moth (all 27th June). I've noticed very low numbers of common species in my garden, such as Heart and Dart and Large Nutmeg. I've also had my first Lappet hatch yesterday from over-wintered Iarvae - an impressive moth!"

**Dave Morris** added **Olindia schumacherana** to his Seer Green, Bucks garden list on 27th June. A two-site trapping session with *Robert Payne* on 28th June yielded just over 200 moths of 65 species, a few of which were new for this year's UTB list: Church Wood RSPB Reserve at Hedgerley, Bucks Blotched Emerald, Tortrix viridana/Green Oak Tortrix, Small Yellow Wave, Treble Brown Spot & Bird's Wing; Chiltern Woodland Burial Park at Jordans, Bucks Elophila nymphaeata/Brown China-mark. As always seems to be the case, most species were represented by 1 or 2 individuals except for a total of 41 Light Emerald and 15 Lobster Moth at the two sites.

Steve & Xander Goddard have been getting improved catches in their Wolvercote, Oxon garden of late, with Waves to the fore: Small Fan-footed Wave on 25th June followed by Riband Wave and Single-dotted Wave on 26th June. Dipleurina lacustrata was also recorded on the latter date, while their first ever Small Elephant Hawk-moth was seen on 24th June.



Adam Hartley has had two more year ticks in his central Oxford 40w actinic trap, with Enarmonia formosana on 25th June and Phtheochroa rugosana on 26th June, while on 28th June Adam got Eudonia mercurella, Epiblema roasaecolana, Large Yellow **Underwing, Snout & Fan-foot.**

#### **Rob Payne** had a walk in Black Park, Bucks on 26th June and found Epiblema uddmanniana/Bramble Shoot Moth and Tortrix viridana/Green Oak Tortrix.

*Martin Wainwright sent this report:* "My trap at Thrupp, Oxfordshire played host to both forms of the **Peppered Moth** on 25th June. Melanics were unusual in Leeds during our 25 years there, although once the dominant form in heavy industrial areas. Interesting to see how frequent they are in Oxfordshire. The trap continues to be busy, with two Privet Hawk-moths among an average of 80 moths nightly, but the most interesting find on 26th June was one forlorn hindwing of a Scarlet Tiger on nettle and Rosebay Willowherb a few feet away. Waring, Townsend and Lewington note that the male of this moth "patrols wildly in late afternoon and early evening"; but not wildly enough, apparently, to escape our many bats or birds."

The following day he visited Whitecross Green Wood, Bucks where Tortrix viridana (1), Silver-ground Carpet (1), Grass Rivulet (1) & Burnet Companion (4) were seen.

#### ~ Thursday 27th June 2013 ~

Dave Wilton has added the following new species to the year list over the past week: Luquetia lobella & Pempelia formosa at Westcott, Bucks on 19th June, Adela croesella, Tischeria ekebladella, Scrobipalpa costella, Choristoneura hebenstreitella, Perinephela lancealis & Small Fan-foot all in Bernwood Forest on 21st June, Commophila aeneana at Greatmoor, Bucks on 25th June, Nemapogon cloacella & Light Emerald at Westcott on 25th June and Beautiful Hook-tip near Steeple Claydon, Bucks on 26th June. Dave visited two Chimney Sweeper colonies during the daytime on 26th June and saw the moth in very good numbers at both of them. Pilch Fields near Great Horwood, Bucks produced 43 while the small wildlife area next to the village hall in Akeley, Bucks managed 41.

# ~ Tuesday 25th June 2013 ~

*Tom Stevenson* found a **Scalloped Hazel** on 21st June in the centre of Benson, Oxon whilst clearing some vegetation, while on 23rd June he found his first **Scarlet Tiger** of the year on the Broad Beans in his Benson allotment. Tom also reports that he ran two

125w MV traps at Millbrook Mead Nature Reserve in Benson on 14th June with the following results: Common Swift (1), Pseudargyrotoza conwagana (1), Celypha striana (1), Celypha lacunana (4), Hedya pruniana/Plum Tortrix (1), Epiblema cynosbatella (2), Scoparia ambigualis (1), Eurrhypara hortulata/Small Magpie (5), Figure of Eighty (1), Flame Carpet (3), Silver-ground Carpet (2), Common Marbled Carpet (9), Green Carpet (4), Mottled Pug (1), Common Pug (1), Grey Pug (2), Lesser Treble-bar (1), Yellow-barred Brindle (1), Clouded Border (1), Scorched Wing (1), Peppered Moth (5), Clouded Silver (10), Eyed Hawk-moth (1), Poplar Hawk-moth (2), Buff-tip (1), Poplar Kitten (1), Swallow Prominent (1), Pale Tussock (3), White Ermine (2), Cinnabar (1), Heart & Dart (27), Flame Shoulder (3), Large Yellow Underwing (1), Setaceous Hebrew Character (2), Shears (4), Light Brocade (4), Campion (1), Lychnis (1), Shoulder-striped Wainscot (1), Poplar Grey (1), Dagger sp (1), Coronet (1), Marbled Minor sp (8), Large Nutmeg (4), Rustic Shoulder-knot (6), Treble Lines (14), Vine's Rustic (6), Burnished Brass (1) & Spectacle (2). Tom passes on thanks to Marc Botham for help with IDs, otherwise he'd still be at it today!

Wendy Wilson reported the following: "At Otmoor, Oxon on Tuesday afternoon 18th June, Shelagh Harlow and I were checking the **Brown Hairstreak larvae** and found two in the car-park. They were not yet fully grown, being 10 and 12 mm long; usually they are pupae by now. While we were there, Shelagh spotted a final instar Magpie Moth caterpillar on the blackthorn. It has attractive markings (see photo) and was a first for both of us. It too should be a pupa by now according to the book. Also, on my way to Otmoor, I stopped off at Great Haseley and saw my first Yellow Shell moth of the season."

**Steve & Xander Goddard report:** "A busy three nights in Wolvercote, Oxon, on the 19th, 20th and 21st June, the 19th especially where in perfect conditions 114 moths of 44 species was, we think, a garden record. We had one more **Telechrysis tripuncta** that night, but also our first **Large Yellow Underwing** as well as **Clouded Brindle**, **Green Pug** and **Argyresthia semifusca**. A smaller catch on 21st June included

*Keith Mitchell reports* that a first for his Stoke Goldington, Bucks garden on 19th June was Teleiodes Iuculella. The supporting cast included Common Swift, Chrysoteuchia culmella, Celypha Iacunana, Udea olivalis, Chinese Character, Common Marbled Carpet, Green Carpet (14), Common Pug, Scorched Wing, Brimstone Moth,

Common White Wave, Privet Hawk-moth, Eyed Hawk-moth, Pale Prominent, Pale Tussock, White Ermine, Buff Ermine, Cinnabar, Heart and Dart, Flame, Flame Shoulder, Setaceous Hebrew Character, Bright-line Brown-eye, Shoulder-striped Wainscot (3), Brown Rustic, Large Nutmeg, Rustic Shoulder-knot, Marbled Minor agg, Middle-barred Minor (6), Treble Lines, Mottled Rustic, Burnished Brass, Silver Y, Spectacle, Straw Dot & Fan-foot.

#### ~ Friday 21st June 2013 ~

Dave Wilton sent the following report: "At Westcott, Bucks two new macro-moth species have been added to the garden list over the past week. On 16th June a Pretty Chalk Carpet was an unexpected visitor because we're a good 15 kilometres from its normal habitat in the Chilterns and there's no local foodplant (Traveller's Joy) unless its larvae can use cultivated varieties of clematis. In pristine condition the moth does indeed look pretty - unfortunately mine wasn't! Then on 18th June a pristine Rednecked Footman graced the trap. This lichen-feeding species is expanding its range, following (rather more slowly) in the footsteps of the Orange Footman. Other recent sightings here have included the following: on 16th June Nematopogon metaxella & Uncertain; on 17th June Epiblema trimaculana; on 18th June Parapoynx stratiotata/Ringed China-mark & Phlyctaenia perlucidalis; on 19th June Hedya nubiferana, Epinotia bilunana, Rhopobota naevana, Acentria ephemerella/Water Veneer, Phlyctaenia coronata, Udea olivalis, Buff Arches & Dark Arches. Overnight garden trapping sessions have of late been averaging somewhere between 30 and 40 species, against which the list for 19th June was exceptional with more than 370 moths of 92 species recorded that night (the kind of mid-June result I'd expect in a "normal" year). The recent warmer weather also permitted a welcome increase in activity away from the garden and I've managed to record the following species new to this year's list elsewhere in Bucks: Shark (one I forgot about, trapped back on 11th June near lvinghoe); Forester & Yellow Shell (both in the daytime on 14th June in Bernwood Meadows); Hypochalcia ahenella & Map-winged Swift (trapped during a Bucks Invertebrate Group meeting on 15th June near Radnage); Glyphipterix thrasonella (a daytime sighting on 17th June at Leaches Farm along the River Ray); Argyresthia spinosella, Epermenia falciformis, Ptycholoma lecheana, Ancylis diminutana, Rhyacionia pinivorana, Small Seraphim & Mottled Beauty (all trapped on 17th June in Finemere Wood); Eupoecelia angustana, Eucosma cana, Epiblema uddmanniana, Crambus perlella, Fern, Shaded Pug & Treble-bar (all trapped on 18th June near lvinghoe); Elachista maculicerusella, Agapeta hamana, Clepsis spectrana, Aphelia paleana, Chrysoteuchia culmella, Nomophila noctuella/Rush Veneer & Small Clouded Brindle (all trapped on 19th June near Latimer)."

#### ~ Thursday 20th June 2013 ~

Adam Hartley writes: "Catches in my central Oxford garden using my 40w actinic trap have improved noticeably over the last week or so. Amongst the usual stuff a couple of micros which may be new for the Upper Thames recording area year list are one **Tachystola acroxantha** on 17th June and one **Mompha raschkiella** on 20th June."

**Dave Ferguson** found **Epiblema sticticana** at Springfield Farm Landfill, Bucks during the afternoon of 16th June, resting on the larval host plant of Coltsfoot, while on 19th June he saw 20 males and two females of **Cataclysta lemnata (Small China-mark)** flying around a ditch in the heathland area of Black Park, Bucks.

On 14th June Martin Wainwright's light trap at Thrupp, Oxon attracted a female Ghost Moth, Poplar Hawk-moth, Poplar Grey, Eurrhypara hortulata/Small Magpie, Peppered Moth (non-melanic), Coronet and micro Cochylis atricapitana. On 17th June he got one of the biggest collections of the season so far, including Marbled Minor sp., Middle-barred Minor, Snout (2, one brown, the other grey), Buff Ermine, White Ermine, Buff-tip, Grass Rivulet, micro Celypha Iacunana, Large Nutmeg, Brown Rustic and Grey Pug. He was put off trapping the following night because of a bee swarm, but did see a Slow Worm! On 19th June the catch included a Coxcomb Prominent and no less than seven Elephant Hawk-moths (as Martin says, "What

Tom Stevenson sent this message on 18th June: "I am assured by respondents on the iSpot web-site that the attached photo is of Anthophila fabriciana (Nettle-tap Moth). Lots of these around at Ewelme Watercress Beds, Oxon this morning, on nettles."

Steve & Xander Goddard report some decent catches in their Wolvercote, Oxon garden of late. New species included Celypha striana & Silver Y (14th June), Buff-tip & Shears (15th June), Adaina microdactyla (16th June), Evergestis forficalis/Garden Pebble (17th June, from a catch of 42 moths of 20 species) and Telechrysis tripuncta & Willow Beauty (18th June, the former a good record and new to the All-time UTB list).

*Marc Botham reports:* "Nothing like the night that Dave and Peter had (see 14th June below), but things are starting to pick up a bit. New for the list, perhaps, are Caloptilia robustella, Teleiodes luculella and Ingrailed Clay from Bagley Woods, Oxford on 15th June, Netted Pug in my garden at Benson, Oxon on 16th June and Snout in the garden on 17th June. Larval records have included Vapourer, Clouded Drab, Greenbrindled Crescent and Herald (near Slough, Berks on 13th June) and lots of Mallow larvae all over Common Mallow plants in my garden, first seen on 16th June."

*Nigel Partridge* has sent in some more new records for the year from his garden in Loosely Row, Bucks: Depressaria heraclei (12th June) and Scoparia pyralella, Netted Pug & Reddish Light Arches (all 16th June).

Welcome to first-time contributors Tim and Tony Clark, who are new to mothing having only recently acquired a trap. "We have mostly run it in our back garden in Banbury, Oxfordshire but have recently bought an inverter to allow us to place it in nearby countryside. Since then our catch has increased, both in number of individuals and number of species. We can report that last night (16th June) we had Ghost Moth, Middle-barred Minor, Pseudargyrotoza conwagana and Scoparia pyralella. The trap was run in woodland near Horley, Oxfordshire."

# ~ Monday 17th June 2013 ~

*Wendy Wilson sent this message:* "On Friday 14th June, at Denham Country Park in Bucks I spotted my first **Straw Dot** of the season. It was flitting about in the long grass in the marshy field during a brief sunny spell. The attached photo was the best I could manage. There were a few butterflies around, including my first Small Copper, but lepidoptera were outnumbered four to one by damselflies. Yesterday a lone **Speckled Yellow** braved the wind at nearby Black Park where I usually see lots."

Peter Hall and Dave Wilton ran four MV lights for three hours in Bernwood Forest on 14th June, getting Common Swift, Incurvaria oehlmanniella, Nematopogon swammerdamella, Monopis weaverella, Syndemis musculana, Capua vulgana, Spatalistis bifasciana, Hedya pruniana, Apotomis turbidana, Lobesia religuana, Ancylis mitterbacheriana, Ancylis obtusana, Ancylis laetana, Epinotia immundana, Epinotia tedella, Epiblema cynosbatella, Crambus lathoniellus, Eurrhypara hortulata/Small Magpie, Scalloped Hook-tip, Oak Hook-tip, Pebble Hook-tip, Chinese Character, Peach Blossom, Figure of Eighty, Poplar Lutestring, Little Emerald, Birch Mocha, Maiden's Blush, Blood-vein, Cream Wave, Red Twinspot Carpet, Silver-ground Carpet, Common Carpet, Purple Bar, Common Marbled Carpet, Grey Pine Carpet, Spruce Carpet, Broken-barred Carpet, Green Carpet, May Highflyer, Haworth's Pug, Foxglove Pug, Dwarf Pug, Small White Wave, Seraphim, Yellow-barred Brindle, Tawny-barred Angle, Brown Silver-line, Scorched Wing, Brimstone Moth, Scalloped Hazel, Peppered Moth, Willow Beauty, Pale Oak Beauty, Brindled White-spot, Common White Wave, Common Wave, White-pinion Spotted, Clouded Silver, Lobster Moth, Iron Prominent, Pebble Prominent, Great Prominent, Swallow Prominent, Coxcomb Prominent, Pale Prominent, Pale Tussock, Orange Footman, White Ermine, Least Black Arches, Flame Shoulder, Setaceous Hebrew Character, Shears, Pale-shouldered Brocade, Poplar Grey, Miller, Alder Moth, Knot Grass, Coronet, Large Nutmeg, Small Dotted Buff, Marbled White Spot, Green Silver-lines, Oak Nycteoline, Nut-tree Tussock, Beautiful Golden Y, Plain Golden Y, Straw Dot & Common Fan-foot (inappropriately named because it is far from common, the last species is a Bernwood speciality). With more micros in pots still to be confirmed, close to 100 species were trapped and it felt like the first "proper" result of the year. Timing was impeccable because the heavens opened just as the entry barrier was locked up on departure!

*Mary Elford* reports only four moths in her Bampton, Oxon trap overnight on 13th June but one was a very fresh and neat-looking **Elephant Hawk-moth**.

Dave Maunder sent another update from Aylesbury, Bucks: "Some moths found in the garden trap over the last couple of weeks have been: Poplar Hawk-moth (3, 8th June), Campion (1, 6th June), Pebble Prominent (2, 7th June), Buff-tip (1, 9th June), Brown Rustic (1, 7th June), Spectacle (1, 7th June), Sycamore (1, 11th June), Waved Umber (1, 8th June) along with regulars Peppered Moth (8), Scalloped Hazel (12), Rustic Shoulder-knot (14), Heart and Dart (11), Cabbage Moth (2) and Bright-line **Brown-eye** (2). Other species found in a rough field near Coldharbour Way were: Marsh Pug (10+), Small Yellow Underwing (6), Burnet Companion (1), Mother Shipton (6), Silver Y (3 on 11th June, my first of the year), Celypha lacunana (2), Angle Shades (1), Drinker larvae (8), Pyrausta aurata (1), Green Carpet (40+), Common Carpet (2) and Agonopterix arenella (1). All were found on 11th/12th June. I returned to the rough field on 14th June with Peter Hall and despite the strong breeze we recorded a further six Marsh Pugs along with Small Yellow Underwing (6), Mother Shipton (5), Anthophila fabriciana (1), Endothenia gentianaeana (4), Glyphipterix simpliciella (1), Celypha lacunana (5), Epiblema scutulana (2), Lobesia abscisana (1), Elachista argentella (1) & Pammene germmana (1). Marsh Pug is an uncommon species in the county, this being only the fifth location and by far the largest number seen. One more moth we found was a Marbled White Spot (14th June) which Peter netted in my local field near Miles End - I've not seen this species here before. I also found 9 Puss Moth eggs here on 5th/6th June which have now hatched in captivity."

*Marc Botham* reports an **Eyed Hawk-moth** in his garden trap at Benson, Oxon on 14th June.

Steve & Xander Goddard report: "Not a bad collection over the last couple of nights in Wolvercote, Oxon. On 11th June, 51 individuals of 28 species, including Blastobasis lacticolella, Broad-barred White, Depressaria heraclei, Pseudargyrotoza conwagana and Straw Dot, which I think are all new to the region this year. Also pleased to get a Sandy Carpet as well as our first garden Peppered Moth." Steve adds that on 13th June they caught Hedya pruniana as well as Lychnis and Cinnabar.

#### ~ Friday 14th June 2013 ~

*Martin Wainwright* tells us he was very excited to have caught a **Puss Moth** on 9th June, snoozing some 20 yards from the trap in his garden at Thrupp, Oxon. Other species in that catch included Clouded-bordered Brindle, Pebble Prominent, Bufftip, White Ermine and Lychnis. On 10th June one Pyralis farinalis (Meal Moth) was found indoors by his wife Penny. Martin recorded this moth in similar circumstances last August at his previous home in Leeds and wonders if one of its larvae may have stowed away. On 11th June the overnight catch included an Eyed Hawk-moth, along with Scorched Wing, Setaceous Hebrew Character, Pebble Prominent, Iron Prominent, White Ermine, Green Carpet, Brimstone Moth, Shears and about eight other species still to be sorted.

~ Sunday 9th June 2013 ~

Andy King sent this message on 7th June: "A week ago, on 1st June, a pristine Campion flew into the house. I attach a photo of the moth which I think is particularly

attractive when fresh. On my Hartstongue Fern in the backgarden in Chorleywood, Bucks I have a resident colony of **Psychoides verhuella.** However, looking for it today I overturned a fern leaf and found a **Psychoides filicivora** instead. This is not entirely surprising as I have bred them in past years (from other counties) and possibly it is descended from escapees. Then again, maybe not - it has been found in Hertfordshire and Middlesex. This small moth presents a rather austere, minimalist photograph - still attractive in my opinion, for what it's worth. Almost as an afterthought I checked your alltime list: it's not on there!"

#### ~ Monday 3rd June 2013 ~

Andy King sent this report: "On 1st April I collected some Spruce cones from the ground at Rushmere Park, Bucks, near the border with Bedfordshire. On 14th May Cydia strobilella moths emerged from them. This species has a status of Nationally Scarce level B, but I got six moths from 13 randomly-picked cones, so I wonder! Peter Hall identified them for me as there are several similar species. Rather more exciting is the Acleris abietana specimen which came to light in Philipshill Wood, Chorleywood, Bucks on 6th May: it certainly doesn't look the part, being small, brown and tatty, but would appear to be a first for southern and south-eastern Britain. It is a rare and local animal in Scotland and northern England; so far the nearest records I can trace are three in Herefordshire and Worcestershire and then the next is in Cheshire. Interesting speculation may be had as to how and why it got here. Once again, Peter was involved in its identification."

# ~ Sunday 2nd June 2013 ~

Dave Wilton sent this report: "An improvement in the weather has meant that the last two days of May allowed me to give a small boost to the species total. Heart & Dart came to the garden trap at Westcott, Bucks on 30th May, while Common Swift and **Common Marbled Carpet** followed on 31st May. Daytime sightings on the latter date included Neofaculta ericetella, Bactra lancealana, Speckled Yellow, Common Heath & Mother Shipton all at Black Park, Bucks and then Adela rufimitrella, Glyphipterix simpliciella, Glyphipterix fuscoviridella, Grapholita jungiella, Opsibotys fuscalis, Grass Rivulet, Small Yellow Underwing & Burnet Companion all at Asham Meads, Bucks. No sign of Forester yet at the latter site so, like many other species, it is presumably taking its time about emerging this year. Three hours with one trap in the car-park at Rushbeds Wood, Bucks that evening produced a welcome 50 species, although few moths were present in any numbers (Orange Footman with eight examples being the winner). Species seen included Bucculatrix nigricomella, Eulia ministrana, Cream Wave, Broken-barred Carpet, Sandy Carpet, Scorched Wing, Pale Oak Beauty, Common White Wave, Poplar Grey, Brown Rustic, Small Angle Shades & Treble Lines."

# ~ Friday 31st May 2013 ~

**Adam Hartley writes:** "I've been struggling to catch much at all using my 40W actinic Heath trap in central Oxford over the last week. New for the garden for the year have been **Pyrausta aurata** on 25th May, a dark form of **Prays fraxinella** (Ash Bud Moth) on 26th May and a **Dark/Grey Dagger** and a lovely **Poplar Hawk-moth** both on 28th May."

However, a **May Highflyer** in my garden trap at Westcott, Bucks on 26th May was a first record for the site (and for the 10km square) so proved to be a very pleasing discovery. A grand total of eight moths attended the trap that night, the others being **Red Twin-spot Carpet** (1), **Small Phoenix** (1), **Scorched Carpet** (1, only the second example ever recorded here), **Muslin Moth** (2) & **Hebrew Character** (2)."

# ~ Sunday 26th May 2013 ~

Also a battered Bright-line Brown-eye, a Pebble Prominent and seven Chocolate Tips, one with much more subdued tips than the norm in terms of colour. The night of 20th May saw Clouded Border, two Clouded Silvers, a Rustic Shoulder-knot, a Small Quaker, a Yellow-barred Brindle, a Red Twin-Spot Carpet, an Agonopterix arenella and the year's first Maybug." Martin subsequently added that Aglossa pinguinalis (Large Tabby) was found indoors on 23rd May.

**Dave Morris and Rob Payne** ran two traps (a 50W Skinner MV and a 20W Actinic Heath) overnight at the RSPB's Church Wood at Hedgerley, Bucks on 17th May and did rather well: **Nematopogon swammerdamella** (1), **Scalloped Hook-tip** (1), **Maiden's Blush** (3), **Red Twin-spotted Carpet** (2), **Water Carpet** (1), **Small Phoenix** (2), **Redgreen Carpet** (1), **Oak-tree Pug** (1), **Brown Silver-line** (5), **Brimstone Moth** (2), **Early Thorn** (1), **Scalloped Hazel** (1), **Engrailed** (1), **Grey Birch** (1), **Iron Prominent** (1), **Lesser Swallow Prominent** (1), **Coxcomb Prominent** (3), **Great Prominent** (9), **Marbled Brown** (2), **Orange Footman** (2), **Least Black Arches** (2), **Common Quaker** (1), **Clouded Drab** (1), **Angle Shades** (2), **Nut-tree Tussock** (5) & **Silver Y** (1).

**Adam Hartley writes:** "Results have been very poor over the last few nights in my garden in central Oxford with mostly an empty trap to show for my efforts. Last night (17th May) though, using my 40W actinic trap, I actually managed to catch a couple of moths: **Early Grey** (1) and **Pale Mottled Willow** (1) which is new for the year for my garden."

*Martin Wainwright reports a warmer night on 16th May at Thrupp, Oxon:* "It brought nice rewards after a very sparse spell, with a big **Swallow Prominent,** two male **Muslin Moths** and a **Flame Shoulder,** plus a battered **Hebrew Character** and two slugs."

Andy King sent this report: "Running a light-trap doesn't seem particularly worthwhile just at the moment, so I've been out to find them: two female Adela reaumurella were found, looking brand new but a bit forlorn on the wet vegetation and two adult Phyllonorycter maestingella hiding under Beech leaves, where it's a bit drier. I found these while looking for Eriocrania leaf-mines on Birch in Philipshill Wood, Bucks on 14th and 16th May. I'm pleased that I discovered four species: Eriocrania sangii, Eriocrania cicatricella, Eriocrania unimaculella and Eriocrania semipurpurella. It took longer to ID them than to find them!".

# Friday 17th May 2013 ~

**Dave Wilton has been searching for leaf-mines again:** "It is just as well that there's always something to do, even in cool, dull weather. Most of the birch-feeding Eriocrania species are under-recorded locally and now is the time to look for their larval stage leaf-mines. At Finemere Wood, Bucks on 16th May I found active larvae of Eriocrania unimaculella, Eriocrania sangii and Eriocrania semipurpurella, while in Bernwood Forest, Bucks on 17th May I found those three again along with Eriocrania salopiella."

*Dave Morris* found a Cinnabar at the Chiltern Woodland Burial Park near Seer Green, Bucks on 16th May.

*Mary Elford reports:* "Still very poor results from my actinic garden trap in Bampton, Oxon when I do run it but I notice that of the miserable total of 12 moth species, 4 have not been recorded here before, including a **Puss Moth** on 8th May. All very puzzling."

#### Thursday 16th May 2013 ~

*Ched George* found a female **Muslin Moth** in Park Wood, Bradenham, Bucks on 13th May.

*Marc Botham reports:* "A couple more species from April that Peter Hall has kindly identified for me: **Depressaria daucella** at Warburg, Oxon on 13th April and **Acleris logiana** at Bagley Woods, Oxford on 14th April. Also to add to the list are **Shuttle-shaped Dart** and a **Dagger** (Grey or Dark not confirmed yet) in my Benson, Oxon garden on 12th May."

#### Monday 13th May 2013 ~

**Dave Wilton reports:** "I'm still getting next to nothing in my garden moth trap at Westcott, Bucks and the result from 12th May is typical: **Red Twin-spot Carpet** (1), **Swallow Prominent** (1), **Powdered Quaker** (2), **Common Quaker** (2), **Clouded Drab** (3) & **Hebrew Character** (7). The bats which turn up whenever the light is turned on probably don't help but, apart from the very occasional Hebrew Character wing, there are few signs that they're having much feeding success other than with craneflies. The knock-on effect of so few moths flying must be quite significant higher up the food chain. A nest of early-instar **Lackey** caterpillars was found on hawthorn in the garden on 13th May. When photographed there were about 50 sunning themselves on their web and another 50 or so feeding on nearby branches."



## Wednesday 1st May 2013 ~

Adam Hartley sent this report: "One more to report which might well be a new species for the year: Caught on the 25th April in my central Oxford garden a Caloptilia rufipennella. The ID has been confirmed from photos by Richard Lewington and Phil Sterling no less!"

Andy King is no longer so sure about his 'avalanche' of moths! "There do seem to be winners and losers with the late Spring, the Quakers, for instance, not doing so well. I have four 'odds and ends' to report, which I don't think have registered on your 2013 list yet. Attached is a photo of **Phyllonorycter emberizaepenella** which emerged in April from a leaf-mine I had collected on 10th October 2012 on honeysuckle in Chartridge, Bucks. I suppose it may count as a 2012 moth, but this species is not so often reported (probably because no-one fancies spelling the name!). A **Phyllonorycter salicicolella** emerged from some dead leaves off a sallow tree at College Lake Nature Reserve (just in Bucks) on 14th March 2013. Neither of these emergence dates count as they were brought indoors. A **Ruby Tiger** was found as a caterpillar, hibernating under loose bark on a fallen log at Rushmere Park, Bucks on 1st April. Flying in the sunshine over heather at Stoke Common, Bucks on 25th April was an **Incurvaria pectinea**, despite windy conditions (another photo)."

# Friday 26th April 2013 ~

24th April - Amblyptilia acanthodactyla (1), Aphomia sociella/Bee Moth (1 female), Brimstone Moth (1), Brindled Beauty (2 male), Common Quaker (7), Double-striped Pug (11), Early Grey (3), Early Thorn (3), Hebrew Character (3), Herald (2), Streamer (1), Twin-spotted Quaker (2). A few new species there, I think. Certainly some considerable improvement in numbers and range of species, although I think it is due to turn colder at the weekend so that's not likely to continue."

Marc Botham has added a few more species to his year list: Agonopterix umbellana & Nut-tree Tussock (Shotover, Oxon 23rd April); Drinker Iarva (Little Wittenham Hill Farm, Oxon 23rd April); Vapourer eggs (Buttler's Hangings, Bucks 24th April); White-marked, Scorched Carpet & Lunar Marbled Brown (Little Wittenham on 24th April); Agonopterix alstromeriana (Benson, Oxon 24th April); Purple Thorn & Frosted Green (Bagley Woods, Oxon 25th April). Marc notes that numbers are still very low all round.

At Bracknell in Berks David Rowe had Yellow Horned to light back on 10th March, a Herald on 16th April, a possible Frosted Green on 21st April (pending confirmation of a photograph) and two Lunar Marbled Browns on 23rd April.

#### Thursday 25th April 2013 ~

**Dave Maunder sent this update on 25th April:** "Still very poor results from my garden trap here in Aylesbury, Bucks. Very low compared to this time last year, with often only singles of **Clouded Drab, Hebrew Character** and **Early Grey,** although slightly higher last night (24th). I did find an interesting micro at our local sports centre in the form of **Ypsolopha mucronella.** My captive **Lappet larvae** are off and feeding again after hibernation and I have attached a photo - they're all 4th instar, I think."

Although it wasn't really the kind of night that anyone in their right minds would want to be sitting on exposed chalk grassland, three individuals of Mottled Grey (uncommon in Bucks) were trapped so that made it worthwhile. Other species caught, mostly under tree cover, were Diurnea fagella, Shoulder Stripe, Brindled Pug, Water Carpet, Oak Beauty, Engrailed, Small Quaker, Clouded Drab, Common Quaker, Twin-spotted Quaker, Hebrew Character, Satellite & Chestnut.

*Mary Elford sent this report:* "I found this moth resting on a fence in my garden in Bampton, Oxon on 15th April. I've not seen it or recorded it here before so I checked the photo with my moth advisers (Richard Comont and Martin Townsend) who agree that it is a **Tawny Pinion.** I notice that it was last recorded on the UTB website in 2010 so it was lovely to see it, especially after all the dreadful weather over the last couple of years."

*This was received from Steve and Xander Goddard:* "First proper night's mothing for the year in Wolvercote, Oxon overnight on 14th April (again a Robinson MV trap) - not a great variety of species (only six), but a good few more than we'd got on any previous night this year. Specifically, Hebrew Character (8), Common Quaker (6), Clouded Drab (5), Twin-spotted Quaker (3), Brindled Beauty (1, male) and Pale Pinion (1). On 15th April we had Clouded Drab (7), Common Quaker (6), Hebrew Character (4), Small Quaker (2), Early Grey (1) & Diurnea fagella (1)."

*Nigel Partridge* tells us that he finally managed a trapping session on 15th April in Loosley Row, Bucks and included amongst the catch was **Diurnea fagella**.

*During the daytime on 14th April Dave Wilton visited Kingswood, Bucks* and achieved his first confirmed sighting of Light Orange Underwing for the year. That

evening he ran an MV light at Finemere Wood, Bucks and, amongst 167 moths of 18 species, got Semioscopis steinkellneriana, Agonopterix ocellana, Brindled Pug, Early Thorn and Red Chestnut. A Dotted Chestnut, new to the site, was also caught (this species seems to be having a good season).

# Friday 12th April 2013 ~

Mary Elford tells us that she's been suffering from moth deprivation for months! However, "this morning (11th April) there were Clouded Drab (3) and Early Grey (2) in my trap here in Bampton, Oxon. Compared to 2012, the Early Grey's debut is exactly 3 months later to the night. The only other moths I had seen this year were an Angle Shades (first adult) that my keen-eyed grandson found on the landing on 20th March and a Plume moth that I disturbed while gardening. Hopefully you'll soon be inundated with moth sightings."

**Andy King** has sent us two very interesting pictures. During a visit to Rushmere Park near Heath and Reach (just inside Bucks) on 1st April Andy found some larval spinnings on broom characteristic of **Agonopterix assimilella**, which if confirmed might well be a first record for the county. One of the caterpillars is illustrated here. He has also had an indoor emergence of **Stigmella tityrella** from a leaf-mine on beech collected at Chorleywood, Bucks on 30th October last year. The adult pictured below is barely 3mm in length.

Thursday 11th April 2013 ~

**Dave Maunder sent this update from Aylesbury, Bucks on 11th April:** "In my garden trap last night I got **Clouded Drab** (2), **Hebrew Character** (1) and **Early Grey** (1) - a pretty poor night's catch. I also found a **Common Quaker** at the Fairford Leys shops and an **Acleris literana** at Hartwell House (a first for me!)."

# Wednesday 10th April 2013 ~

**Dave Wilton reports:** "Recent frost-free nights have meant a small improvement to catches in my garden trap at Westcott, Bucks with numbers now just getting into double figures thanks to **Clouded Drab** and **Hebrew Character**, while **Endrosis sarcitrella** (White-shouldered House Moth) was found indoors on 8th April. Over the past week I've been searching evergreen Holm Oaks for larvae of **Ectoedemia heringella** which should be fully grown now (the moth, a fairly recent invader, was first recorded in Bucks last winter). Locating the trees has been the bigger challenge! Leaf-mines have been recorded on almost every one found around Aylesbury and eastwards but the furthest west that I've seen evidence of the moth has been at Quainton, Bucks on 3rd April; trees in the Claydons and closer towards Oxfordshire seem to have escaped it thus far. Some Holm Oaks can have many mines per leaf and it can be quite disfiguring to the foliage, much like the damage caused to Horse Chestnuts by Cameraria ohridella."

Dave Maunder lists the moths he's found around Aylesbury, Bucks over the last few weeks: "Oak Beauty (1, 9th April), Engrailed (1, 8th April in Finemere Wood on an

oak trunk), **Orange Underwing** (1, 6th April at Grangelands), **March Moth** (2 on 18th March, 1 on 8th April), **Shoulder Stripe** (1, 7th April), **Dotted Border** (1, 19th March) and **Clouded Drab** (1, 8th April in my garden trap). So still lean pickings on the moth front!"

## Monday 8th April 2013 ~

*This report came from Dave Morris on 8th April:* "Nothing new for the year, but I'm so pleased to see some moths in my Seer Green, Bucks garden: 2 x Common Quaker, 1 x Small Quaker, 1 x Early Grey, 1 x Yellow Horned. It must be spring!"

*Mark Calway* reports sightings of seven **Orange Underwings** and a single **Acleris ferrugana/notana** flying in the sunshine at Padworth Common, Berks on 6th April.

## Wednesday 3rd April 2013 ~

**Dave Wilton had a result at Westcott, Bucks on 2nd April:** "I wouldn't normally get so excited over a worn **Clouded Drab** but this is the first moth which has entered my garden trap for about three weeks. What an awful start to the season. A quick check shows that my garden produced 28 individuals of 11 species up to 31st March, whereas over the same period in 2012 it was 1,454 moths of 37 species. There's a lot of catching up to be done this year and I'm looking forward to Andy King's 'explosion'!

## Monday 1st April 2013 ~

*This report was received from Andy King on 31st March:* "As far as I can gather there are very nearly no moths flying anywhere during these cold nights. Perhaps we might expect an 'explosion' if and when we get a mild night. However, in the mean time, a **Tinea pellionella** turned up indoors at home in Chorleywood, Bucks on 23 March. Given what they eat as caterpillars I expect I'll find a hole in one of my pullovers sooner or later."

## Sunday 31st March 2013 ~

Adam Bassett sent this message from Marlow Bottom, Bucks: "I forgot to send over this record from last month, Ypsolopha ustella (thanks to Dave Wilton for the confirmation). It was lurking in a kitchen cupboard on February 19th."

## Monday 11th March 2013 ~

*Marc Botham sent this report on 11th March:* "A few weeks back, I can't remember exactly when but most likely 16th/17th February, I went out to check my over-wintering moth larvae that I had kept outside on some potted Docks here at Benson, Oxon. Amongst them were a couple of larvae that I hadn't put there. I paid them little attention at the time as they were Noctua-looking. As it happens, now they have grown up, one is in fact a Noctua, **Broad-bordered Yellow Underwing,** but the other was a far better surprise as its markings have become much clearer and its size has helped give it away too – it's an **Old Lady.**"

*This message came from Dave Maunder on 10th March:* "Today I was given a specimen of a **Small Magpie** by my father-in-law who lives in Adstock, Bucks which I can only assume has overwintered in his house and hatched recently - my earliest ever record for this species! Other moths seen in Aylesbury, Bucks over the last two days were **March Moth** (1) on 8th March and **Clouded Drab** (1), **Early Moth** (1) & **Dotted Border** (3) all 9th March".

# Sunday 10th March 2013 ~

**Steve Goddard** ran his Robinson MV trap at Wolvercote, Oxford on 8th March and got a Small Quaker, a first for his garden and an addition to this year's UTB list.

(1), Epiphyas postvittana/Light Brown Apple Moth (1); 6th March Oak Beauty (1), Dotted Border (1), Chestnut (1), Acleris notana/ferrugana agg. (1), Emmelina monodactyla (1), Hofmannophila pseudospretella/Brown House Moth (1); 7th March in my garage Alucita hexadactyla/Twenty-plumed Moth (1) and in the trap Small Brindled Beauty (1), Dotted Border (1), Chestnut (2), Acleris notana/ferrugana agg. (3), Epiphyas postvittana/Light Brown Apple Moth (1), Amblyptilia acanthadactyla (1)."

## Friday 8th March 2013 ~

**Dave Maunder sent this report on 7th March:** "After Tuesday's warm weather I only managed to get a couple of moths to my garden trap in Aylesbury, Bucks that night, which were **Early Grey** (1) and **Pale Brindled Beauty** (1, antennae illustrated below). Down the road at the Fairford Leys sports fields I found six **Dotted Borders** at security lamps, so the warm weather must have induced a hatching of this species here!"



# Wednesday 6th March 2013 ~

**Dave Wilton** ran one MV light at Finemere Wood, Bucks for three hours on 5th March and was pleased to get 13 species: Acleris ferrugana/notana, Tortricodes alternella, Yellow Horned, March Moth, Shoulder Stripe, Small Brindled Beauty, Pale Brindled Beauty, Spring Usher, Engrailed, Common Quaker, Grey Shoulder-knot, Satellite & Chestnut.

*Marc Botham sent this report on 6th March:* "There was a Lead-coloured Drab in the Rothamsted trap at CEH Wallingford, Oxon last night. Things are finally improving a little in the garden (at Benson) as well although I've nothing new to add to the UTB 2013 list: March Moth (4), Small Brindled Beauty (1), Early Moth (1), Dotted Border (1), Hebrew Character (2) & Satellite (3)."

*In his first report for the website, Ashley Beolens from Great Holm in Milton Keynes, Bucks* tells us that he caught a **Lead-coloured Drab** in his garden trap on 4th March followed by an **Oak Beauty** on 5th March.

# Saturday 2nd March 2013 ~

The following report came from Dave Wilton on 28th February: "The weather offered few opportunities to run a trap during February so my interest was kept going through leaf-miner emergences. Another dozen adult micro-moths appeared during the month from mines collected in Bucks last autumn. Although they had been kept in an unheated north-facing room, the fact that they were indoors at all meant that emergence times were considerably at variance to the norm but it was still a worthwhile exercise to get confirmation of species. They included **Stigmella viscerella** (from Elm at Lenborough Wood), **Stigmella centifoliella** (from Dog Rose at Calvert), **Phyllonorycter froelichiella** (from Alder at Stockgrove Country Park), **Phyllonorycter platani** (from London Plane in Aylesbury) & **Phyllonorycter schreberella** (from Elm at a number of sites, including Westcott).

Apart from the odd **Pale Brindled Beauty** and one **Acleris notana/ferugana** the trap has only really been visited by flies and ichneumons."

**Dave Wilton** managed to find a sheltered spot at Finemere Wood, Bucks on 31st January and in a couple of hours one MV light brought in **Tortricodes alternella** (1), **Small Brindled Beauty** (1), **Pale Brindled Beauty** (8), **Spring Usher** (13) & **Early Moth** (1).

**This report came from Dave Wilton:** "I have added just one more moth to my garden year list here at Westcott, Bucks with **Acleris schalleriana** caught on 4th January. Not really countable towards this year's total but on 9th January I had two moths emerge from leaf mines which had been kept indoors. One was **Phyllonorycter harrisella** and the other **Tischeria ekebladella**, both of which were collected from an oak near Hogshaw, Bucks on 30th September 2012. Many of my records for the latter moth are of the distinctive larval stage leaf mines so, even though it is just a tiny 'boring brown job', it was nice to get a good view of the adult for a change!"

## Tuesday 8th January 2013 ~

**Dave Maunder sent this report on 5th January:** "After 3 night's trapping here in my Aylesbury, Bucks garden I finally managed to get a female **Chestnut** moth on 4th January!"

#### Saturday 5th January 2013 ~

**Chris Bottrell** tells us that catches in his Merton (Oxon) garden fizzled out more than expected towards the end of 2012 with very few moths and nothing new for the list. "In the 96 sessions of 2012, in total I only caught one more moth (4012 v 4011) than I had in 2010 when I only trapped 50 times. I trapped 98 times in 2011 and caught a total of 7847 moths which is almost twice the count for 2012. Anyway, 2013 is now off to a roaring start with the trap going out on the 1st January and catching my usual first moth, a solitary Agonopterix heracliana."

*Marc Botham adds to his last message from Benson, Oxon:* "The trap was even busier last night (2nd January) with a couple of **Dark Chestnuts** and 3 **Chestnuts** added to the mix. I have also found a few **Angle Shades** and **Large Yellow Underwing** larvae in amongst the mess created by the rabbits I keep."

*Dave Wilton* ran an MV trap at Finemere Wood, Bucks for a few hours on 2nd January and caught about 40 moths of eight species, comprising Acleris ferrugana/notana, Acleris hastiana, Winter Moth, Pale Brindled Beauty, Spring Usher, Mottled Umber, Early Moth and Chestnut. In his Westcott, Bucks garden on 4th January he found a single Acleris aspersana.

**On 4th January Dave Maunder sent this report:** "My only moth so far this year is one **Winter Moth** found on New Year's Day at Fairford Leys football fields (Aylesbury, Bucks). Nothing came to my garden trap the last two nights apart from numerous Midges, Gnats, Flies and a couple of Vine weevils! Very poor considering the mild temps."

*This report came from Dave Morris on 4th January:* "Not the most exciting moth to start my year list off, but in my Seer Green, Bucks kitchen not 5 minutes ago - Hofmannophila pseudospretella (Brown House Moth)."

## Wednesday 2nd January 2013 ~

*Marc Botham sent the following report from Benson, Oxon:* "Despite it being incredibly mild over Christmas the rain and often strong winds mixed with the apparent

lack of moths meant that my moth trap was most often empty – of moths at least as there were still plenty of slugs and flies. As such there was nothing to report for December, but last night (1st January) I caught my earliest **Early Moth**, along with a **Satellite**, **Winter Moth** and **Mottled Umber**."

**Dave Wilton** reports that the traditional New Year's Day Brown Hairstreak egg hunt at Otmoor, Oxon on 1st January also produced a ring of Lackey eggs and a handful of Blue-bordered Carpet eggs.

*Rob Payne had a* Pale Brindled Beauty outside his flat in Langley, Bucks this morning (2nd January).

#### Tuesday 1st January 2013 ~

Well done to Ali Driver for spotting the first UTB moth of the year on 1st January: "Had my first moth of the year on the first day of the year - Emmelina monodactyla which I disturbed whilst unfuzzing my New Year's Day head with a long awaited spot of gardening at home in *Sonning, Berks.*"
