Wood White Species Champion Report 2017 Nick Board

The good news is that the number of reported sightings came from 11 different individuals and thus it would appear that the early season publicity relating to the Wood White helped a great deal in that respect.

It is hoped to engage these "reporters" early again next year and to further expand the network.

7 sights were visited of which 4 recorded sightings (*), with the stronghold areas being Wicken and the adjoining Leckhampstead Woods. Good news from the very north of the county where Stoke Park Wood also recorded sightings as late as 6th August (see attached schedule).

Concerns:

Wicken Wood – whilst this is a stronghold, it is reported that there has been a decline in the management of the wood.

We know who the current owners are and we need to explore what contact BC has/has not had with them.

Leckhampstead Wood – this privately owned wood is also used as a pheasant shoot and although the owner is sympathetic to our cause, it may be its management is not synchronised to suit both pheasant and butterfly.

County Boundaries

Our butterflies do not restrict themselves to county boundaries so why should the future management of their habitat seem to do so?

It is now the time to pool resources and work together across BC area teams to try to secure the future of the Wood White before it is too late.

Immediate future

"**Back from the Brink**" initiative – whilst funds have been made available to support the future of the Wood White, including in the South Northants area, the UTB stronghold areas of Wicken and Leckhampstead may fall outside of the remit.

A meeting was held with with Sharon Hearle (BC Reg Co ordinator) on the 6th October to explore the current plans for this initiative, how I can be involved and whether the habitats which fall within the UTB can also benefit.
